INTRODUCTION

Continued anxiety and evolving information regarding the COVID-19 virus may cause some families to choose to keep students at home instead of enrolling them in an in-person, in-building model. For those PCSD1 families who prefer an online program, our District provides an online curriculum for students K-12 through Colorado Digital Learning Solutions and Fuel Education. There are no costs to PCSD1 students for these services. Both online systems are “self-contained,” in that they provide licensed teachers, curricula, and tech support. PCSD1 does not provide an online program for preschool-aged children.

STEPS TO TAKE IN ORDER TO ENROLL STUDENTS IN THE PCSD1 ONLINE PROGRAM

1. Starting on August 5, email or call Mrs. Kay Genschorck, PCSD1 Director of Instructional Services, to indicate your interest in enrolling your student(s) in the PCSD1 Online Program. Mrs. Genschorck’s contact information is kgenschorck@pcsdk12.org and 303-838-7666, x1019. At that time, Mrs. Genschorck will review the online enrollment contract with families as well as determine if there are additional technology challenges.
2. Mrs. Genschorck will refer families to the appropriate academic counselor in order to develop student schedules. Once this step is completed, the counselor will notify Mrs. Genschorck, appropriate building level administrators, and Mrs. Shelly Carlstrom, so that we can assure attendance reporting compliance.
3. Upon receipt of a signed online contract, Mrs. Genschorck will handle all registration for students K-8 and will guide 9-12 students to self-register.
4. Once classes start, Mrs. Genschorck will provide all families with weekly progress updates. Building administrators will be included in the communication chain.
5. Once students have been registered, families may indicate that they wish to enroll for in-person instruction (in lieu of continued online programming) anytime prior to Sep. 8, OR at the end of the first quarter for DCES and FMS students, AND/OR at the end of the semester for all PCSD1 students.
6. At the end of the first semester, building administrators will reach out to all online students/families to determine whether or not they wish to continue with online classes or return to in-building courses.

3rd: L.A.3, math 3, elective(s)

4th: L.A.4, math 4, science 4, social studies 4

5th: L.A.5, math 5, science 5, social studies 5

6th: L.A.6, math 6, social studies or science, elective

7th: L.A.7, math 7, social studies 7, elective

8th: L.A.8, math 8, science 8, elective

9th: Eng 9-1, Alg 1A, Earth Science A, elective

10th: Eng 10A, Geometry A, Biology A, World History A*

11th: Eng 11A, Alg2A or Consumer MathA, US History A or elective, Physical Science A or elective*

12th: Eng 12A, Government, Economics, if needed math or science, otherwise elective*

*If students have finished required courses at a specific grade level, they may choose an elective in lieu of a required course.
